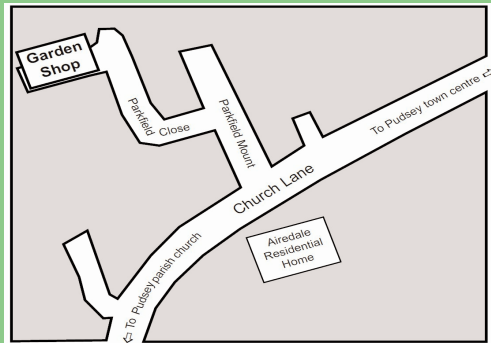

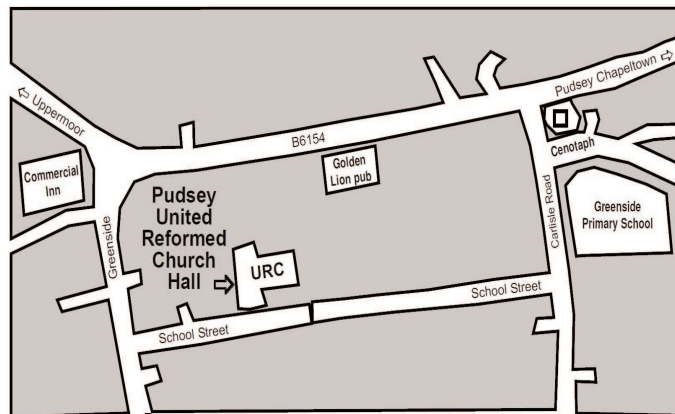

## Class 80 PUDSEY UPSIDEDOWN CAKE (Makes one 8 inch cake)

### For the Topping

50g/1.5 oz Softened Butter  
50g/1.5 oz Soft Brown Sugar  
Tin of 7 Pineapple rings in syrup  
7 Glacé cherries

### For the Cake

100g/3.5 oz Butter  
100g/3.5 oz Golden Caster Sugar  
100g/3.5 oz Self-raising Flour  
1 teaspoon Baking Powder  
1 teaspoon Vanilla extract  
2 Eggs

1. Make the topping by first beating 50g of softened butter and 50g soft brown sugar together until creamy.
2. Spread over the base of a 20 cm (8 inch) round cake tin and a quarter the way up the sides.
3. Arrange pineapple rings on top of the mixture (reserve syrup for later), with glacé cherries in the ring centres.
4. Make the cake. Place the cake ingredients in a bowl with 2 tbsp of the reserved pineapple syrup. Beat to a soft consistency (Ideally with an electric whisk.)
5. Spoon the mixture into the tin on top of the pineapple. Smooth out until level.
6. Bake for 35 minutes at 180C/160C fan/325F/Gas4
7. Leave to stand for 5 minutes then turn out upside down onto a plate.

# RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1 a) All exhibits in the Flower and Vegetable Sections must have been grown by the exhibitor, or owned by him/her for not less than three months.  
b) All exhibits in the Children, Home Produce and Handicrafts Section must have been made by the exhibitor.  
c) All exhibits in the Photography Section(s) must have been taken by the exhibitor.  
d) To ensure fairness and prize opportunities for new exhibitors, the maximum number of exhibits that may be entered in any one class by an exhibitor is 2.
- 2 Classes 5 to 21 inclusive to be staged in vases provided by the Association.
- 3 Silk/Artificial flowers are not allowed in the Floral section.
- 4 a) Any prize may be modified or withheld at the Judges discretion if an exhibit is considered undeserving of the prize offered.  
b) Any exhibitor disqualified for exhibiting produce or items not his own will forfeit any prize money he may have gained.
- 5 The Committee accepts no responsibility for loss of, or damage to exhibits though every reasonable care will be taken, and the making of an entry indicates acceptance of these rules.
- 6 Entries bearing marks other than staging tickets and variety name where available may be disqualified.
- 7 Exhibitors wishing to donate exhibits at the close of the Show should mark such exhibits with a sticker obtained from the Show Secretary. Unmarked exhibits will be deemed reserved. After the close of the show, all Exhibitors will have 30 minutes opportunity to remove their Exhibits, after which all items not marked will also become the property of the Association.
- 8 a) Any person lodging an objection to any exhibit/exhibitor must do so before 4pm on show day, and must themselves be an exhibitor in the class in question. Any protest or objection must be made in writing and lodged with the Show Secretary together with a fee of £5 (returned if the protest is sustained).  
b) For the purpose of adjudicating on any objection, the Committee reserves the right to inspect the garden or allotment of any exhibitor either on or after Show Day.
- 9 The decision of the Judges is final, unless a protest is sustained.
- 10 The ruling of the Committee shall be final on any point not covered by these rules.
