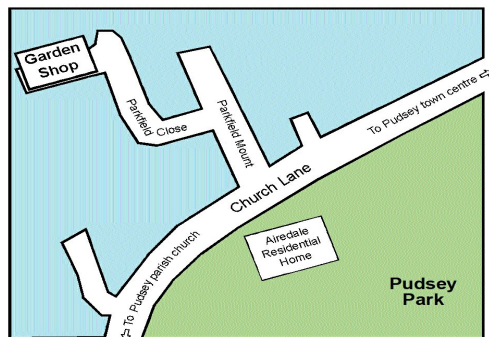


OPENING TIMES FOR OUR GARDENERS' SHOP

NEW EXHIBITORS WELCOME!

Anyone can take part in our shows, so why not come along and have a go? You might win a prize or a Trophy - plus the kudos of being awarded one of our coveted certificates.

1) Register To Enter in advance

Because we need to work out the space needed to display 100s of different items across all our classes, you can't just turn up with your entries on the day of the show.

That's why you need to register first. Tell us your name and the classes you want to enter, we give you a sticker with your entry number (one for each item) to display with your exhibit. This also anonymises your entry, guaranteeing all judging is completely fair.

You can register in person at the Hall the night before the show from 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm. Or you can do it online, then pick up your tickets as you arrive to display your exhibits.

2) Stage Your Exhibits on the day (or the night before)

Once you have your entry stickers, you can set out - or "stage" - your exhibits on the appropriate table. Each class is clearly marked with a number and description. Show Stewards will be on hand to help if you have any questions.

As long as you have registered first, you can stage on Friday night from 7.00pm to 9.00pm. Or on the Saturday morning of the show 9.00am to 11.00am.

Class 88 PUDSEY TEALOA F RECIPE (Makes 6-8 slices)

Ingredients

300ml (1/2 pint) strained cold tea
100g (4 oz) raisins
100g (4 oz) sultanas
100g (4 oz) mixed peel
1 egg
75g (3 oz) plain wholemeal flour
75g (3 oz) plain flour
50g (2 oz) light brown soft sugar
5ml (1 tsp) baking powder

1. Mix together the tea, raisins, sultanas and mixed peel and leave to soak at least 8 hours or overnight.
2. Lightly grease a 900ml (1 1/2 pint) loaf tin and line with greaseproof paper.
3. Add the egg, flours, sugar and baking powder to the tea and plumped fruit. Mix well and pour into prepared tin.
4. Bake in the oven at 180 degrees C (350 degrees F/gas mark 4) for 1 hour or until it pulls away from the sides and feels firm to touch
5. Turn onto wire rack to cool completely.
