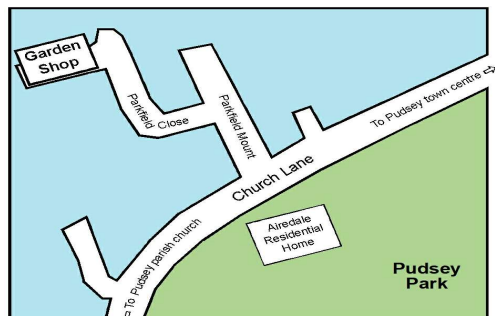

Class 122 PUDSEY APPLE TEALOAIF RECIPE

100 g (4 oz) Butter	1. Lightly grease a 900 g (2 lb) loaf tin and line with greaseproof paper.
100 g (4 oz) Caster Sugar	2. Mix together all the ingredients.
2 medium Eggs	3. Pour into the prepared tin and level the surface.
1 tablespoon of honey	4. Bake in the oven at 180 degrees C (350 degrees F / gas mark 4) for 50 minutes, or until well risen and it feels firm to touch
100 g (4 oz) Sultanas	5. Turn out of the tin onto a wire rack and allow to cool completely.
225 g (8 oz) Self-raising Flour	
1 teaspoon ground mixed spice	
1 medium apple, peeled, cored & chopped

ENTRY FEES & PRIZES

- ◆ **To help fund the prize money for our winners, in common with many shows we charge exhibitors a small fee to enter.**
- ◆ Fees are 50p per entry, up to a maximum fee per exhibitor of £5 - after which your further entries are FREE. **Entries by Children (in any class are FREE.**
- ◆ Prize money and vouchers are paid out at 5.30 pm when the show closes.

STAGING TIMES

You can set out - or “stage” - your Exhibits during the following times;

SATURDAY 5th SEPTEMBER 8:45 am. to 11:00 am.

COLLECTING EXHIBITS AFTER THE SHOW

The show does not finish until 5.30pm. Your Exhibits can ONLY be collected once it is officially announced that the show is closed, and collected by no later than 6.30pm.



Class 128 THE 100gm BALL CHALLENGE

We first ran this creative challenge in Spring 2025, and were knocked out by all the entries. So it's now a permanent feature in our Shows!

You can enter any item crafted (eg. knitted or crocheted) from 100 gms of wool/yarn (traditional standard sized ball). You can use accessories such as buttons or ribbon, and multiple colours are allowed - but only up to 100gms of wool in total. And yes, the judges will weigh it!
