

#### PUDSEY APPLE TEALOAF RECIPE

100 g (4 oz) Butter 100 g (4 oz) Caster Sugar

2 medium Eggs

1 tablespoon of honey 100 g (4 oz) Sultanas

225 g (8 oz) Self-raising Flour

1 teaspoon ground mixed spice 1 medium apple, peeled, cored 5.

& chopped

- 1. Lightly grease a 900 g (2 lb) loaf tin and line with greaseproof paper.
- 2. Mix together all the ingredients.
- 3. Pour into the prepared tin and level the surface.
- 4. Bake in the oven at 180 degrees C (350 degrees F / gas mark 4) for 50 minutes, or until well risen and it feels firm to touch
- Turn out of the tin onto a wire rack and allow to cool completely.

#### Class 128 THE 100gm BALL CHALLENGE

We ran this creative challenge for the first time in Spring 2025, and were knocked over by all the entries. So it's back by popular demand for the 2025 Summer Show!

You can enter any item crafted (eg. knitted or crocheted) from 100 gms of wool/yarn (traditional standard sized ball). You can use accessories such as buttons or ribbon, and multiple colours are allowed - but only up to 100gms of wool in total. And yes, the judges will weigh it!
